The council, which has about 170 MSME associations from different States as its members, pointed out that copper prices had increased by 110% this month compared with April last year. Prices of aluminium alloy had risen 94%, mild steel plates by 82% and CRCA sheets by 96%.



The MSMEs faced working capital erosion because of the high cost of inputs. While the units supplying to public sector undertakings (PSUs) were unable to get a revision in prices of their products, the open market was unable to take the full impact of high raw material prices, the council said.

"In spite of a drop in demand due to lockdown, prices are on the upswing, particularly steel, pig iron and other raw materials," the group said in a release on Wednesday.

It urged the government to set up a mechanism to ensure raw-material-price-stability for MSMEs. The PSUs should allow MSMEs to cancel orders without imposing a penalty and permit them to quote revised prices. The government should also allow import of all steel materials based on cost and quality requirements at nil duty and ban export of iron ore and steel products, it added.

Speaking on the joint effort of All India Council of Associations of MSMEs, he said, "We have been working on combining these associations under one umbrella since the first lockdown was Imposed by the Government of India, We have been able to bring in 170 industry associations under one roof across

the country. We have started the consultations with every association and we are soon planning to highlight the challenges faced by different sectoral MSMEs. We will be sharing the draft recommendations with the ministries concerned to look into the low points and address the issues."

Elaborating the problems, Bertwal pointed out that the Centre had auctioned fron ore mines 110 million tonne annual production last year out of which

50% (with lor who ha-

ve their captive consumption) are only operational and rest are shut. He feels that the Centre should immediately take necessary steps to start the production in those mine.

He also suggested that iron ore fines below 55% and pallets are exempted from export duty whereas pallets made from iron ore fines over 55%, wherein process of making pallets does not involve any value addition. This is exported which creates shortage as well as loss to the government exchequor Hence pallets should have 30% export duty" he added.

MSMEs worried over rising raw material costs

THE rise in prices of steel, iron ore, aluminum, copper, plastics, paper and other raw materials has sparked concern among the MSME sector as they have sought the intervention of Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

All India Council of Association of MSMEs, created by around 170 MSMEs, created by around 170 MSME associations covering approximately 2,00,000 industries pan-India, stated in a release that steel and other base material manufacturers are declaring 10 to 20 times higher profit whereas MSMEs are on the verge of extinction. This clearly shows that corporate and public sector unit commodity companies are profiting at the expense of MSMEs.

"This volatile situation is temporary in nature, however can cause permanent damage to the MSME sector. In spite of a drop in demand due to lock-down, prices are in upswing, particularly steel, pig iron and other raw materials too. It is obvious there is a cartel created by steel manufacturers, which include both private and public sector undertakings. Steel is an essential commodity for overall development of the country and exports should be as per availability of surplus," said a release.

AICA has urged the Union government to allow National Small Industries Corporation Limited (NSIC) to hedge steel for all MSMEs. "They should be in a position to consolidate and hedge overall steel quantity in the market place. This kind of hedging should be possible for a period of one year (as rate contract extends for a year). NSIC should make bulk bookings of steel at a price with the option of taking deliveries within 12 months as fixed," AICA said in a statement.

Similarly, public sector units like Steel Authority of India and Vizag Steel should focus on MSMEs for supply of materials on priority basis and all steel industries should allocate at least 40 per cent of their production for Indian MSMEs, the release added.

High raw material prices threaten survival of MSMEs

Industry group urges nil duty on import of steel materials

A steep increase in raw material prices in the last few months threatens the survival of micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs) in the manufacturing sector, the All India Council of Associations of MSMEs said.

The council, which has about 170 MSME associations from different States as its members, pointed out that copper prices had increased by 110% this month compared with April last year. Prices of aluminium alloy had risen 94%, mild steel plates by 82% and CRCA sheets by 96%.



The MSMEs faced working capital erosion because of the high cost of inputs. While the units supplying to public sector undertakings (PSUs) were unable to get a revision in prices of their products, the open market was unable to take the full impact of high raw material prices, the council said.

"In spite of a drop in demand due to lockdown, prices are on the upswing, particularly steel, pig iron and other raw materials," the group said in a release on Wednesday.

It urged the government to set up a mechanism to ensure raw-material-price-stability for MSMEs. The PSUs should allow MSMEs to cancel orders without imposing a penalty and permit them to quote revised prices. कोरोना वायरस महामारी से सबसे ज्यादा प्रभावित एमएसएमई उद्योग ने हाल ही में आल इंडिया काउंसिल आफ एसोसियेसन आफ एमएसएमई (एआईसीए) का गठन किया है। इस परिषद में 170 के करीब उद्योग संघों ने हाथ मिलाया है। प्रधानमंत्री को भेजे एक ज्ञापन में एआईसीए ने इस्पात, लौह अयस्क, एल्यूमीनियम, तांबा, प्लास्टिक्स, पीवीसी, कागज और रसायन जैसे कच्चे माल के दाम में भारी वृद्धि के चलते कार्यशील पूंजी में कमी और औद्योगिक इकाइयों के समक्ष खड़ी चुनौती का जिक्र किया है। एआईसीए ने कहा है, हमारा मानना है कि मौजूदा उतार चढाव स्थित का

छोटे उद्यमों का बड़ा संकट

क्ष्म, लघु और मझौले उद्यम (एमएसएमई) स्म, लघु आर मज्ञाल उठा राज्य सम्बद्धित समित्र सम्बद्धित समित्र समि अर्थव्यवस्था की मजबूती के लिए एमएसएमई का मजबत होना अनिवार्य है। लेकिन भारत में अर्थव्यवस्था की रीढ़ यानी एमएसएमई कमजोर, कुपोषित और उपेक्षित है। अर्थव्यवस्था पर इसका असर स्पष्ट तौर पर दिख भी रहा है। जब भी कभी किसी झटके से कमजोर रीढ़ हिलती-डुलती है, अर्थव्यवस्था निढाल-सी पडी दिखाई देती है। नोटबंदी, जीएसटी और अब कोरोना महामारी के झटके इसके उदाहरण हैं। लेकिन अर्थव्यवस्था के इस कमजोर क्षेत्र को मजबूत करने के लिए अभी तक काम कम, बातें ही अधिक हुई हैं। कमजोर, कुपोषित और उपेक्षित श्रेणी के ऐसे उद्यमों की संख्या देश में कोई छह करोड़ तैंतीस लाख है और बरी हालत में भी ये देश के सकल घरेलू उत्पाद (जीडीपी) में लगभग तीस फीसद का योगदान करते हैं। देश की पैंतालीस फीसद से अधिक श्रमशक्ति यहां रोजगार पाती है। यदि अर्थव्यवस्था के इस क्षेत्र को थोड़ा मजबूत कर दिया जाए तो देश की तस्वीर बदल सकती है।

सरकारी परिभाषा में एमएसएमई का निर्धारण निवेश राशि और कारोबार राशि की सीमा से होता है। एक करोड़ रुपए तक निवेश और पांच करोड़ रुपए तक सालाना कारोबार करने वाला उद्यम सूक्ष्म श्रेणी में आता है। वहीं दस करोड़ रुपए तक निवेश के साथ पाचास करोड़ रुपए तक सालाना कारोबार करने वाले उद्यम को लघु श्रेणी में रखा गया है। जबकि पाचार करोड़ रुपए तक निवेश और सालाना ढाई सौ करोड़ रुपए तक का कारोबार करने वाले उद्यम को मध्यम श्रेणी का माना जाता है। यानी ढाई सौ करोड़ रुपए कोरोबार के बाद कारपोरेट जगत की सीमा शुरू हो जाती है।

एमएसएमई क्षेत्र के उद्यम कई सारी चुनौतियों का एकसाथ सामना करते हैं। इनमें भी सूक्ष्म उद्यमों की

चुनौती ज्यादा बड़ी है। कई बार तो सूक्ष्म उद्यम किसी एक उद्यमी द्वारा संचालित किए जाते हैं। मजदूर से लेकर मैनेजर तक की भूमिका एक अकेला व्यक्ति ही निभाता है। ये उद्यमी कम पढे-लिखे होते हैं और आधुनिक प्रौद्योगिकी, आधुनिक बाजार की रीति-नीति से अपरिचित होते हैं। ऐसे उद्यम वित्तीय समस्या, प्रौद्योगिकीय समस्या, कुशल श्रमिकों की अनुपलब्धता और उत्पादों के विपणन की समस्या से जझते रहते हैं। इन तमाम समस्याओं के कारण ये उद्यम उस गुणवत्ता के उत्पाद नहीं बना पाते, जिस गुणवत्ता के उत्पाद बड़े उद्यम बनाने में सक्षम होते हैं। सूक्ष्म उद्यमों के उत्पाद महंगे भी होते हैं। पूंजी के अभाव में ये अपने उत्पादों का बाजार में प्रचार-प्रसार भी नहीं कर पाते। खराब गणवत्ता, अधिक कीमत और प्रचार-प्रसार के अभाव के कारण सुक्ष्म उद्यमों के उत्पाद बाजार में टिक नहीं पाते।

इनके लिए अपनी लागत निकाल पाना कठिन हो जाता है। स्वयं को जिंदा रखने की जद्दोजहद के बीच नोटबंदी, जीएसटी और कोरोना महामारी जैसे झटके इन्हें तोड़ कर रख देते हैं। यहां गौर करने वाली बात यह है कि देश के एमएसएमई क्षेत्र में 99.4 फीसद (छह करोड़ तीस लाख) हिस्सा सूक्ष्म उद्यमों का है। लघु उद्यम 0.52 फीसद यानी तीन लाख इकतीस हजार और मध्यम उद्यमों की हिस्सेदारी मात्र 0.007 फीसद यानी पांच हजार ही है।

ऑल इंडिया मैन्युफैक्चरर्स ऑगंनाइजेशन (एआइएमओ) के एक सर्वे के अनुसार पिछले सवा साल के कोरोना काल के दौरान पैतीस फीसद एमएसएमई को अपने कारोबार बंद करने को मजबूर होना पड़ा। कारोबार बंद होने से बेरोजगारी बढती है। बेरोजगारी बढने से मांग घटती है और मांग घटने से अर्थव्यवस्था टूटती है। सेंटर फॉर मॉनिटरिंग इंडियन इकोनॉमी (सीएमआइई) के आंकड़े बताते हैं कि ग्यारह जुन को बेरोजगारी दर 12.35 फीसद पर थी। मई महीने में यह 11.90 फीसद थी। लेकिन हैरत की बात तो यह कि सरकार एमएसएमई के बंद होने की बात से ही इनकार कर रही है। सरकार लगातार कह रही है कि एमएसएमई के बंद होने की बात से ही इनकार कर रही है। सरकार लगातार कह रही है कि एमएसएमई के बंद होने से संबंधित कोई आंकड़ा उपलब्ध नहीं है। फिर यह सवाल वाजिब हो जाता है कि क्या सरकार ने आंकड़े जुटाने की कोई कोशिश भी की?

ऐसा भी नहीं है कि सरकार एमएसएमई क्षेत्र के लिए कुछ नहीं कर रही। एमएसएमई को आसान कर्ज उपलब्ध कराने से लेकर उत्पादों के विपणन, प्रौद्योगिकी संवर्धन और कौशल विकास में सरकार विभन्न योजनाओं के तहत मदद करती है। लेकिन ये मदद अपर्याप्त ही कही जाएगी। वित्त वर्ष 2021-22 के बजट



को ही देखें। खादी, ग्रामोधोग और कॉयर उद्योग के लिए कुल आवंटन पिछले साल के 1525.94 करोड़ रुपए से घटा कर इस साल 905.04 करोड़ रुपए कर दिया गया। ग्रीधोगिकी से संबंधित योजनाओं के लिए आवंटन 683.91 करोड़ रुपए से घटा कर 330.31 करोड़ रुपए कर दिया गया। इसी तरह विपणन समर्थन योजना का आवंटन पिछले साल के 74.63 करोड़ रुपए से घटा कर इस साल 39.96 करोड़ रुपए कर दिया गया। एमएसएमई क्षेत्र में कुशल श्रमिकों का अभाव हमेशा एक बड़ी समस्या है। लेकिन उद्यमिता और कौशल विकास के लिए आवंटन में मामूली वृद्धि की गई और इसे 556.47 करोड़ रुपए से बढ़ा कर 570.93 करोड़ रुपए किया गया है। हां. सिर्फ प्रधानमंत्री रोजगार सजन

कार्यक्रम (पीएमईजीपी) के आवंटन में भारी वृद्धि की गई और इसे दो हजार आट सी करोड़ रुपए से बढ़ा कर साढ़े बारह हजार करोड़ रुपए कर दिया गया है। इसी एक योजना के आवंटन के कारण 2021-22 के बजट में एमएसएमई का आवंटन 15,700 करोड़ रुपए हो गया, जो 2020-21 में 7,572 करोड़ रुपए था। लेकिन जीडीपी में एक-तिहाई का योगदान देने वाले, कृषि क्षेत्र के बाद सबसे अधिक रोजगार (लगभग बारह करोड़) पैदा करने वाले, विनिर्माण क्षेत्र में 33.4 फीसद का योगदान करने वाले और देश के निर्यात में पैतालीस फीसद की हिस्सेदारी निभाने वाले क्षेत्र के लिए 15,700 करोड़ रुपए का बजट आवंटन ऊंट के मुंह में जीरे से ज्यादा कुछ नहीं है।

श्रमशक्ति यहां रोजगार पाती है। यदि अर्थव्यवस्था के इस क्षेत्र को थोड़ा मजबृत कर दिया जाए तो देश की तस्वीर बदल सकती है।

सरकारी परिभाषा में एमएसएमई का निर्धारण निवेश राशि और कारोबार राशि की सीमा से होता है। एक करोड़ रुपए तक निवेश और पांच करोड़ रुपए तक सालाना कारोबार करने वाला उद्यम सुक्ष्म श्रेणी में आता है। वही दस करोड़ रुपए तक निवेश के साथ पचास करोड़ रुपए तक सालाना कारोबार करने वाले उद्यम को लघु श्रेणी में रखा गया है। जबकि पचास करोड़ रुपए तक निवेश और सालाना खई सी करोड़ रुपए तक का कारोबार करने वाले उद्यम को मध्यम श्रेणी का माना जाता है। यानी ढाई सी करोड़ रुपए कारोबार के बाद कारपोरेट जगत की सीमा शुरू हो जाती है। एमएसएसई क्षेत्र के उद्यम कई सारी चुनीतियों का

एमएसएमई क्षेत्र के उद्यम कई सारी चुनौतियों का एकसाथ सामना करते हैं। इनमें भी सुक्ष्म उद्यमों की

चुनौती ज्यादा बड़ी है। कई बार तो सुक्स उद्यम किसी एक उद्यमी द्वारा संचालित किए जाते हैं। मजदूर से लेकर मैनेजर तक की भूमिका एक अकेला व्यक्ति ही निभाता है। ये उद्यमी कम पढ़े-लिखे होते हैं और आधुनिक प्रौद्योगिकी, आधुनिक बाजार की रीति-नीति से अपर्णिकत होते हैं। ऐसे उद्यम वित्तीय समस्या, प्रौद्योगिकीय समस्या, चुक्शल श्रमिकों की अनुमलब्धता और उत्पादों के विपणन की समस्या से जुझते रहते हैं। इन तमाम समस्याओं के कारण ये उद्यम उस गुणवत्ता के उत्पाद नहीं बना पाते, किस गुणवज्ञा के उत्पाद बढ़े उद्यम बनाने में सक्षम होते हैं। सुक्ष्म उद्यमों के उत्पाद महों भी होते हैं। चुंजी के अभाव में ये अपने उत्पादों का बाजार में प्रचार-प्रसार भी नहीं कर पाते। खगब गुणवत्ता, अधिक कीमत और प्रचार-प्रसार के अभाव के कारण सुक्ष उद्यमों के उत्पाद बाजार में टिक नहीं पाते।

इनके लिए अपनी लागत निकाल पाना कठिन हो जाता है। रवर्ष को जिंदा रखने की जहीजहद के बीच नोटबंदी, जीएसटी और कोरोना महामारी जैसे झटके इन्हें तोड़ कर रख देते हैं। वहां गीर करने वाली बात यह है कि देश के एमएसएमई क्षेत्र में 99.4 फीसद (छह करोड़ तीस लाख) हिस्सा सुक्ष उद्यमों का है। लघु उद्यम 0.52 फीसद बानी तीन लाख इकतीस हजार और मच्यम उद्यमों की हिस्सेवारी मात्र 0.007 फीसद बानी पांच हजार ही है।

ऑल इंडिया मैन्युफैक्यरर्स ऑर्गनाइनेशन (एआइएमओ) के एक सर्वे के अनुसार पिछले सवा साल के कोरोन काल के दौरान पैतीस फीसद एमएसएमई को अपने कारोवार वंद करने को मजबूर होना पड़ा। कारोवार बंद होने से बेरोजगारी बढ़ती हैं। बेरोजगारी बढ़ने से मांग घटती है और मांग घटने से अर्थव्यवस्था टूटती है। सेंटर फार मॉनिटरिंग इंडियन इकोर्नामी (सीएमआइई) के आंकड़े बताते हैं कि ग्यारह जुन को बेरोजगारी दर 1.25 सेंसर पर थी। मई महीने में वह 11,90 फीसद थी। लेकिन हैरत की बात तो वह कि सरकार एमएसएमई के बंद होने की बात से ही इनकार कर रही है। सरकार लगातार कह रही है कि एमएसएमई के बंद होने से संबंधित कोई ऑकड़ा उपलब्ध नहीं है। फिर यह सवाल वाजिब हो जाता है कि क्या सरकार ने ऑकड़े जुटाने की कोई कंशिश भी की?

ऐसा भी नहीं है कि सरकार एमएसएमई क्षेत्र के लिए कुछ नहीं कर रही। एमएसएमई को आसान कर्ज उपलब्ध कराने से लेकर उत्पादों के विषणन, प्रौद्योगिकी संवर्धन और कौशल विकास में सरकार विभिन्न जीजनाओं के तहत मदद करती है। लेकिन ये मदद अपर्याप्त ही कही जाएगी। वित्त वर्ष 2021-22 के वजट



को ही देखें। खादी, ग्रामोधींग और कॉयर उद्योग के लिए कुल आवंटन पिछले साल के 1525.94 करोड़ रुपए से घटा कर इस साल 905.04 करोड़ रुपए कर दिया गया। मुँधोमिकों से संबंधित योजनाओं के लिए आवंटन 683.91 करोड़ रुपए से घटा कर 330.31 करोड़ रुपए कर दिया गया। इसी तरह विपणन समर्थन योजना का आवंटन पिछले साल के 74.63 करोड़ रुपए से घटा कर इस साल 39.96 करोड़ रुपए कर दिया गया। एमएसएमई क्षेत्र में कुशल अभिकों का अभाव हमेशा एक बड़ी समस्या है। लेकिन उद्योगता और कौशल विकास के लिए आवंटन में मामूली वृद्धि को गई और इसे 556.47 करोड़ रुपए से बढ़ा कर 570.93 करोड़ रुपए किया गया है। हो सिर्फ प्रधानमंत्री रोजगार सजन कार्यक्रम (पीएमईजीपी) के आवंटन में भारी वृद्धि की गई और इसे दो हजार आठ सी करोड़ रुपए से बढ़ा कर साढ़े बारह हजार करोड़ रुपए कर दिया गया है। इसी एक योजना के आवंटन के कारण 2021-22 के बजट में एमएसएमई का आवंटन 15,700 करोड़ रुपए हो गया, जो 2020-21 में 7,572 करोड़ रुपए था। लेकिन जीडीपी में एक-तिहाई का योगदान देने वाले, कृषि क्षेत्र के बाद सबसे अधिक रोजगार (लगभग बारह करोड़) पैदा करने वाले, विनिर्माण क्षेत्र में 33.4 फीसद का योगदान करने वाले और देश के निर्यात में पैतालीस फीसद की हिस्सेवारी मैंभाने वाले क्षेत्र के लिए 15,700 करोड़ रुपए का बजट आवंटन उंट के मुंह में जीर से ज्यादा कुछ नहीं है।

वित्तीय तंगी इस क्षेत्र को सबसे बड़ी समस्या है। सरकार ने एमएसएमई को वित्तीय मदद के लिए पिछले साल तीन लाख करोड़ रुपए की एक आपात कर्ज गारंटी योजना

(ईसीएलजीएस) शुरू की थी। योजना की अवधि मार्च 2021 तक थी।इसके तहत बगैर किसी जमानत के कर्ज लेने की सविधा थी। सरकार की इस योजना से देश के कुल एमएसएमई में से मात्र लगभग चौदह फीसद को ही लाभ मिल पाया। इस कर्ज राशि का भी ज्यादातर इस्तेमाल एमएसएमई इकाइयों ने कर्ज के पुनर्भुगतान में ही किया। सरकार चाहती थी कि एमएसएमई क्षेत्र के उद्यम कर्ज लेकर अपने कारोबार को मजबत करें. ताकि रोजगार पैदा हो और अर्थव्यवस्था का चक्का रफ्तार पकड़े। लेकिन भूखे-प्यासे इतने बड़े क्षेत्र के लिए यह राशि ओस की बूंद से अधिक नहीं थी। वैसे भी बाजार में मांग नहीं है, तो उद्यमी कर्ज लेकर क्या करेंगे? अंतरराष्ट्रीय वित्त निगम (आइएफसी) और इंटेलकैप की 2019 की एक रपट के अनुसार भारत में एमएसएमई क्षेत्र के लिए ऋण की मांग और आपूर्ति के बीच 17.4 लाख करोड़ रुपए की कमी है।

वाजार के मीजूदा हालात में एमएसएमई पर बकावा कर्ज के एनपीए होने का भी खतरा बना हुआ है। इस साल मार्च में फिक्को और इंडियन बैंक एसीिएएरान की तरफ से बैंकरों के बीच किए गए एक सवें में चौरासी फेसर प्रतिभागियों ने एमएसएमई क्षेत्र से एनपीए में वृद्धि होने की आर्शका जताई है। वह भी तब जब सरकार एमएसएमई क्षेत्र का जीडीपी में बोगदान बढ़ा कर पचास संसद करना चाहती है। इस क्षेत्र में पांच करोड़ नई नौकरियां पैदा करना चाहती है। लेकिन इननी सारी समस्याओं वाले एमएसएमई क्षेत्र में क्या वह लक्ष्य हासिल कर पाना संभव है? उम्मीद है 27 जून को जब एक बार फिर अंतरराष्ट्रीय एमएसएमई दिवस मानाय जाएगा तो इस सवाल का जवाब भी तलाशा जाएगा।

MSME body AICA writes to PM, seeks intervention as price of raw material rises

All India Council of Association of MSMEs (AICA), representing around 170 MSME associations, has written to the prime minister urging the government to intervene after a massive spike in key raw material prices hurt MSMEs.

In its letter, AICA has said that there is an erosion in the working capital of MSMEs due to a huge rise in prices of raw materials like steel, iron ore, aluminum, copper, plastics, PVC, paper and chemicals.

It further said that the open market is not accepting the resultant effect of the increase in the price of raw materials. AICA further said that the raw materials are being blocked and stocked in the supply chains.

"We understand this volatile situation is temporary in nature, however can cause permanent damage to the MSME sector. In spite of drop in demand due to lockdown, prices are in upswing, particularly steel, pig iron and other raw materials too," AICA said in a statement.

Between April 2020 and June 2021, the price of copper has surged 109 percent from Rs. 345 to Rs 745 while the price of steel plates have jumped 82 percent from Rs 45 to Rs 82 during the same period.

The industry body has suggested hedging of steel for the MSMEs in order to provide protection against escalation for some period.

"Easy mechanism to hedge steel for all MSMEs, National Small Industries Corporation (NSIC) should act as a consolidation agency. They should be in a position to consolidate and hedge overall steel quantity in the market place. This kind of hedging should be possible for a period of one year," it said.

AICA further suggested that the public sector enterprises must be instructed to accept cancellation of orders from MSMEs without putting a penalty or blacklisting them as an event of increase in the prices of steel is not within the control of the MSMEs.

The industry body also called out for the PSUs to publish steel prices on a quarterly basis and urged that the price should be maintained for a minimum of 3 months at a stretch.

"PSUs like SAIL and Vizag steel should focus on MSMEs for supply of materials on priority basis and all steel industries should allocate at least 40 percent of their production for Indian MSMEs," AICA said in its suggestions.

As a result of the consecutive lockdowns in 2020 and 2021, the MSME sector has been facing a massive liquidity and supply crunch, shortage of labour and non-payment of dues.

The MSME sector in India is said to be the second-largest employment creator after agriculture, providing employment to an estimated 11 crore people. It contributes to 30 percent of the GDP and accounts for 48 percent of the exports.

MSME Body AICA Calls for Immediate Intervention of Prime Minister Narendra Modi-This Is Why

On Wednesday, a subsidiary of SME AICA called for immediate intervention by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on rising prices for raw materials such as steel, iron ore, aluminum, copper, plastic and paper.

170 industry groups have collaborated to form the MSME Council of Micro, Small and Medium (AICA) to address issues in the sector that have been hit hard by the pandemic.

On behalf of the Prime Minister, AICA is steel, iron ore, aluminum, copper, plastic, PVC, paper and chemicals.

"We understand that this volatile situation is temporary, but it can cause permanent damage to the MSME sector. Despite the decline in demand due to the blockade, especially steel, pig iron, Prices for other raw materials are on the rise, too."

Steel and other base material makers have declared 10 to 20 times more profit, but all MSMEs have claimed to be endangered.

The association has proposed eight points to overcome the crisis, which includes protection against price increases over a period of time. Public sector companies must be instructed to accept cancellation of orders from MSME without penalty / blacklist. We need to come up with a formula for price increases. Allocation of MSMEs at concessional prices.

The government said it should allow the import of all steel materials based on cost and quality requirements, without zero import tariffs and anti-dumping. Exports of iron ore and steel products are banned.

MSME should also be allowed to modify prices with new quotes under contracts with governments and suppliers to PSUs, calling escalation clauses for all final government and PSU supplies. Should be allowed to re-estimate.

"If MSMEs become so dysfunctional and choked due to the sharp rise in raw material prices, they will only hinder entrepreneurship and ultimately lead to the failure of the government's goal of Atma Nirbhar Bharath.

"Therefore, we urge the government to take concrete steps to control raw material prices," he said.

Core team members include MV Ramesh Babu, Chairman of the Coimbatore SME Association, Yogesh Pawar, Chairman of Arise, KV Karthik, Chairman of the South Indian Engineering Manufacturers Association, and SC Ralhan, Chairman of the Ludhiana Hand Tools Association.

MSME accounts for 30% of India's GDP, 45% of manufacturing output and 48% of total exports, and employs more than 1.1 billion people. There are about 63.5 million MSMEs in the country.

Steep hike in prices of raw materials are adding to MSME woes: AICA

According to the All India Council of Association of MSMEs (AICA), steep hike in prices of raw materials such as steel, pig iron, copper, aluminium alloy, etc, are adding to the woes of the sector.

In a statement released today, the association said the rise in the price of raw materials has resulted in several challenges such as erosion of working capital, non-availability of basic raw materials, blocking and stocking of raw materials in the entire supply chain and much more.

AICA consists of about 170 MSME Associations covering approximately more than 2,00,000 MSME industries across Pan India. The association has submitted a request to Prime Minister Narendra Modi for an appointment to discuss these issues.

According to AICA, the situation is alarming as MSMEs could be confronted with grave possibilities such as getting black-listed by PSUs and large corporates incase they fail to honour their commitments. The export market which will help in the recovery of the sector and the economy at-large might take a hit in view of the price hike.

Furthermore, the association shared data that indicates how much the prices have skyrocketed in the last one year.

The price of copper reached Rs 745 in June 2021 from Rs 355 in April 2020 (a 109.86 percent hike). Other important raw materials like aluminium alloy, mild steel plate, and CRCA sheet reported 94.34, 82.22 and 95.96 percent increase respectively.

AICA, in its appeal, also rolled out a slew of measures that could help the sector stay afloat amid the crisis. Action points such as PSUs accepting cancellation of orders, quota for MSMEs at concessional prices, GST-based funding, allowing import based on cost and quality, and more can help in controlling the damage within this sector, the statement read.

The Indian MSME sector contributes about 30 percent to the country's GDP and 48 percent to exports. According to a survey by Care Ratings — which was conducted between April 27 and May 11 with a set of 305 respondents, including small and medium businesses — as many as 84 percent of respondents said the deadly second COVID-19 wave escalated business uncertainty.

'Public Sector Enterprises must accept cancellation of orders from MSME with no penalty'

The All India Council of Association of MSMEs on Wednesday said that Public Sector Enterprises must be urged to accept cancellation of orders from MSMEs with no penalty/black listing as steel price increase is a Force Majeure event outside the control of the MSMEs.

It further added that the Goods and Services Tax (GST)-based funding is needed for all MSMEs at very marginal rates which will encourage MSMEs to purchase raw materials.

"MSMEs are the backbone of this economy, contributing to 30 per cent of GDP, 48 per cent of exports and creating job opportunities for 12 crore people, which translates to about 40 crore people of India (one-third of our population approximately) who are dependent on these MSMEs," said the statement.

It must be noted that the steep hike in price of raw materials across all sectors, despite low consumption, and subsequent drop in the production by MSMEs is directly leading to loss of employment, it added.

Reining-in prices

"Government should allow import of all steel materials based on cost and quality requirements at a nil import duty (no anti-dumping) and also ban export of iron ore and steel products. It may be noted that better GDP growth can be realised if value-added products are exported rather than raw materials. This will generate employment too," added the statement.

It further said that the government has always advocated strongly for development of entrepreneurship. However, if MSMEs get crippled and choked due to spiraling price rise of raw materials, it will only discourage entrepreneurship, ultimately leading to failure of the government's objective of Atmanirbhar Bharat.

"Representations made by all associations on this steep hike has yielded no response from the concerned ministries till date. We therefore urge the Government to take concrete steps to rein-in raw material prices at once and save the MSMEs before they get extinct," said the statement.

MSMEs in India add to approximately 30% of the overall employment generated in India. These MSMEs add approximately 30% of the overall GDP of the country. Vijay Beriwal, executive member, AICA, pointed out that the pandemic has affected every industry in the country and MSMEs are hit the most due to frequent lockdowns. From manpower to raw material prices have been posing challenges to their existence. Speaking on the joint effort of All India Council of Associations of MSMEs, he said, "We have been working on combining these associations under one umbrella since the first lockdown was imposed by the Government of India. We have been able to bring in 170 industry associations under one roof across the country. We have started the consultations with every association and we are soon planning to highlight the challenges faced by different sectoral MSMEs. We will be sharing the draft recommendations with the ministries concerned to look into the low points and address the issues." Elaborating the problems, Beriwal pointed out that the Centre had auctioned iron ore mines 110 million tonne annual production last year out of which 50% (with JSW, Arcelor who have their captive consumption) are only operational and rest are shut. He feels that the Centre should immediately take necessary steps to start the production in those mine. He also suggested that iron ore fines below 55% and pallets are exempted from export duty whereas pallets made from 55% > wherein process of making pallets does not involve any value addition. "This is exported thus creating shortage as well as loss to the government exchequer. Hence pallets should have 30% export duty," he added.

170 MSME associations join forces to fight price hike

Coimbatore: At least 170 associations of micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs) in the country have come together to seek the Union government's immediate intervention in controlling the price hike of raw materials. They petitioned the Centre on Wednesday.

In a press note, the All India Council of Association of MSMEs (AICA) said there was a steep rise in the price of raw materials, especially that of steel and pig iron, despite their low consumption and significant drop in the production during the lockdown.

According to AICA, the price of mild steel plate has gone up by 82.22%, aluminium alloy by 94.34%, copper by 109.86%, pig iron by 50%, MS scrap by 48.15% and PVC pipe by 47.44%, since April 2020. AICA has more than two lakh MSMEs as members.

The association said the manufacturers of steel and other base materials were logging 10 to 20 times higher profit, while the MSMEs were on the verge of extinction. It said the steel manufacturers were not fixing the price based on the demand and supply situation in the country, but based on the international market prices.

Because of the price rise, AICA said, the MSMEs could not execute orders at a lower price and they were facing uncertainty of getting blacklisted by the public sector undertakings (PSUs) and large corporate companies, if they could not supply the products as per the agreement.

The association members also demanded the Union government to take necessary steps to bring an easy mechanism to hedge steels for the MSMEs and provide the National Small Industries Corporation (NSIC) powers to consolidate and hedge overall steel quantity in the market.

"The Steel Authority of India Limited (SAIL) and steel makers should publicise prices of long and flat steel products, and HRC coils on a quarterly basis and the price should be maintained for a period of three months at least. PSUs like SAIL and VIzag steel should supply materials to the MSMEs on a priority basis and the steel manufacturers should allocate at least 40% of their production to the local MSMEs," the association said in the press note.

The association also demanded that the MSMEs under the government contract and the suppliers to PSUs should be allowed to revise their price, the government should take steps to provide GST-based funding with minimal marginal rate to them and allow them to import steel materials with nil import duty.

MSMEs' body seeks immediate intervention of PM on rising raw material prices

NEW DELHI: An umbrella body for micro, small and medium enterprises AICA on Wednesday sought immediate intervention of Prime Minister Narendra Modi on rising prices of raw supplies resembling steel, iron ore, aluminum, copper, plastics and paper.

As many as 170 trade associations have joined arms to kind the All India Council of Association of MSMEs (AICA) so as to take care of points of the sector hit laborious by the pandemic.

In a illustration to the prime minister, AICA stated that the sector is going through big challenges as a consequence of erosion of working capital on account of big rise in prices of raw supplies like metal, iron ore, aluminum, copper, plastics, PVC, paper, and chemical compounds.

"We understand this volatile situation is temporary in nature. However, it can cause permanent damage to the MSME sector. In spite of a drop in demand due to lockdown, prices are on the upswing, particularly steel, pig iron and other raw materials, too," it stated.

It claimed that metal and different base material producers are declaring 10-20 instances larger revenue whereas all of the MSMEs are on the verge of extinction.

The affiliation has prompt eight factors to beat the disaster and it consists of safety in opposition to escalation in prices for some interval; public sector enterprises have to be instructed to just accept cancellation of orders from MSMEs with no penalty/ black itemizing; a system needs to be derived for value escalation; and quota for MSMEs at concessional value.

It stated that the federal government ought to enable import of all metal supplies based mostly on price and high quality necessities at zero import responsibility and no anti-dumping; and banning the export of iron ore and metal merchandise.

It additionally really useful that MSMEs, below authorities contract and suppliers to PSU, needs to be allowed to revise their value with contemporary quote and for all finalised authorities and PSU provides, they need to be permitted to invoke escalation clause and requote.

"If the MSMEs get crippled and choked this fashion, as a consequence of spiraling value rise of raw supplies, it can solely discourage entrepreneurship, in the end resulting in failure of the federal government's goal of Atma Nirbhar Bharath.

MSMEs account for 30 per cent of India's GDP, 45 per cent of manufacturing output, 48 per cent of whole exports, and make use of over 11 crore folks. There are about 63.5 million MSMEs within the nation

MSME's Seek PM's Intervention to Control Steel Prices in India

All India Council of Association of MSMEs, formed recently to represent around 170 Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises associations, has written to the India's Prime Minister Mr N Modi urging the government to intervene after a massive spike in key raw material prices hurt MSMEs. AICA has said that there is erosion in the working capital of MSMEs due to a huge rise in prices of raw materials like steel, iron ore, aluminum, copper, plastics, PVC, paper and chemicals. It further said that the open market is not accepting the resultant effect of the increase in the price of raw materials. AICA further said that the raw materials are being blocked and stocked in the supply chains. AICA said "We understand this volatile situation is temporary in nature, however can cause permanent damage to the MSME sector. In spite of drop in demand due to lockdown, prices are in upswing, particularly steel, pig iron and other raw materials too. It is obvious that there is a cartel created by steel manufacturers, which include private and public sector undertakings. Steel is an essential commodity for overall development of the country and exports should be as per availability of surplus. Steel and other base material manufacturers are declaring 10 to 20 times higher profit whereas all the MSMEs are on the verge of extinction. This clearly shows that the corporate and PSU commodity companies are profiting at the expense of MSMEs."

AICA said "Easy mechanism to hedge steel for all MSMEs, National Small Industries Corporation should act as a consolidation agency. They should be in a position to consolidate and hedge overall steel quantity in the market place. This kind of hedging should be possible for a period of one year."

AICA further suggested that the public sector enterprises must be instructed to accept cancellation of orders from MSMEs without putting a penalty or blacklisting them as an event of increase in the prices of steel is not within the control of the MSMEs. The industry body also called out for the PSUs to publish steel prices on a quarterly basis and urged that the price should be maintained for a minimum of 3 months at a stretch. It suggested "PSUs like SAIL and Vizag steel should focus on MSMEs for supply of materials on priority basis and all steel industries should allocate at least 40% of their production for Indian MSMEs."

It has also questioned the fixation of benchmark for steel industry pricing based on international market prices rather than the demand and supply situation in the country.

The MSME sector in India is said to be the second-largest employment creator after agriculture, providing employment to an estimated 11 crore people. It contributes to 30% of the GDP and accounts for 48% of the exports. As a result of the consecutive lockdowns in 2020 and 2021, the MSME sector has been facing a massive liquidity and supply crunch, shortage of labour and non-payment of dues.

"If MSMEs are crippled and suffocated in this way, due to skyrocketing commodity prices, it will only discourage entrepreneurship and ultimately lead to the failure of the Atma Nirbhar Bharath government's goal.

"Therefore, we urge the government to take concrete measures to control the prices of raw materials," he said.

CHENNAI: The rise in prices of steel, iron ore, aluminum, copper, plastics, paper and other raw materials has sparked concern among the MSME sector as they have sought the intervention of Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

All India Council of Association of MSMEs, created by around 170 MSME associations covering approximately 2,00,000 industries pan-India, stated in a release that steel and other base material manufacturers are declaring 10 to 20 times higher profit whereas MSMEs are on the verge of extinction. This clearly shows that corporate and public sector unit commodity companies are profiting at the expense of MSMEs.

"This volatile situation is temporary in nature, however can cause permanent damage to the MSME sector. In spite of a drop in demand due to lockdown, prices are in upswing, particularly steel, pig iron and other raw materials too. It is obvious there is a cartel created by steel manufacturers, which include both private and public sector undertakings. Steel is an essential commodity for overall development of the country and exports should be as per availability of surplus," said a release.

AICA has urged the Union government to allow National Small Industries Corporation Limited (NSIC) to hedge steel for all MSMEs. "They should be in a position to consolidate and hedge overall steel quantity in the market place. This kind of hedging should be possible for a period of one year (as rate contract extends for a year). NSIC should make bulk bookings of steel at a price with the option of taking deliveries within 12 months as fixed," AICA said in a statement.

Similarly, public sector units like Steel Authority of India and Vizag Steel should focus on MSMEs for supply of materials on priority basis and all steel industries should allocate at least 40 per cent of their production for Indian MSMEs, the release added.

MSME body AICA writes to PM, seeks intervention as price of raw material rises

As a result of the consecutive lockdowns in 2020 and 2021, the MSME sector has been facing a massive liquidity and supply crunch, shortage of labour and non-payment of dues.

All India Council of Association of MSMEs (AICA), representing around 170 MSME associations, has written to the prime minister urging the government to intervene after a massive spike in key raw material prices hurt MSMEs.

In its letter, AICA has said that there is an erosion in the working capital of MSMEs due to a huge rise in prices of raw materials like steel, iron ore, aluminum, copper, plastics, PVC, paper and chemicals.

It further said that the open market is not accepting the resultant effect of the increase in the price of raw materials. AICA further said that the raw materials are being blocked and stocked in the supply chains.

"We understand this volatile situation is temporary in nature, however can cause permanent damage to the MSME sector. In spite of drop in demand due to lockdown, prices are in upswing, particularly steel, pig iron and other raw materials too," AICA said in a statement.

Between April 2020 and June 2021, the price of copper has surged 109 percent from Rs. 345 to Rs 745 while the price of steel plates have jumped 82 percent from Rs 45 to Rs 82 during the same period.

The industry body has suggested hedging of steel for the MSMEs in order to provide protection against escalation for some period.

"Easy mechanism to hedge steel for all MSMEs, National Small Industries Corporation (NSIC) should act as a consolidation agency. They should be in a position to consolidate and hedge overall steel quantity in the market place. This kind of hedging should be possible for a period of one year," it said.

AICA further suggested that the public sector enterprises must be instructed to accept cancellation of orders from MSMEs without putting a penalty or blacklisting them as an event of increase in the prices of steel is not within the control of the MSMEs.

The industry body also called out for the PSUs to publish steel prices on a quarterly basis and urged that the price should be maintained for a minimum of 3 months at a stretch.

"PSUs like SAIL and Vizag steel should focus on MSMEs for supply of materials on priority basis and all steel industries should allocate at least 40 percent of their production for Indian MSMEs," AICA said in its suggestions.

As a result of the consecutive lockdowns in 2020 and 2021, the MSME sector has been facing a massive liquidity and supply crunch, shortage of labour and non-payment of dues.

The MSME sector in India is said to be the second-largest employment creator after agriculture, providing employment to an estimated 11 crore people. It contributes to 30 percent of the GDP and accounts for 48 percent of the exports.

It has questioned the fixation of benchmark for steel industry pricing based on international market prices rather than the demand and supply situation in the country.

Seeking an appointment with Prime Minister Narendra Modi to highlight the precarious situation of MSMEs, AICA cautioned that the spiralling rise in prices of raw materials will only discourage entrepreneurship and failure of the government's objective of Atmanirbhar Bharat.
